Review of s6 duty

• What has worked well? What have the barriers been? What will you change?

A significant amount of rubbish was collected during the litter-pick. Given that we have few opportunities to impact on biodiversity due to lack of ownership of any land (and responsibility for maintaining only a small amount of land), our focus has been on embedding biodiversity into our decision making. To this end, the Council has adopted a biodiversity policy and has identified a biodiversity champion.
